Vashon Compost Facility Update

The project to establish a Community Compost Facility on Vashon continues to move forward. After committing funds in their December 2023 budget amendment, King County Solid Waste Division has assigned a capital projects manager to head up the effort. The County is seeking a third party operator to run the facility and will be working to release an RFP by this

July. Once selected, the operator will help the County select the firm that will design the facility. ZWV is pleased to be working with the County as a community stakeholder throughout the process.

Planet Soil

How do we learn to treat our soil more wisely? Planet Soil shows what needs to be done by focusing on the world around us and the fascinating world directly beneath our feet. In recent decades, people have been increasingly 'uprooted' from nature. As a result, many people feel a deep sense of loss and alienation. The film tells the story and development of a group of city dwellers who set out to realize a dream on a small piece of land, just outside the big city. Through the soil, the viewer learns how wondrous and ingenious underground life is. We learn to see that we just need to help the soil a little. This film puts us humans back on



earth-we humans are not separate from nature-we are nature.

The role of soil in the fight towards a better climate is crucial. Soil contains more carbon than in vegetation (trees, oceans, plants and the atmosphere combined), so storing carbon in soil - and understanding how to protect it - are vital to the health of the global ecosystem, and therefore everyone on earth. We see a nature that is not only about struggle and *survival of the fittest*, but above all about *cooperation between micro-organisms*, between the micro and macro worlds and between humans and nature. The film shows, in amazing microphotography, how we need to give nature a hand in order to ultimately help ourselves.

ZWV sponsors this screening of the 2023 Documentary *PLANET SOIL* at the Vashon Theatre for Island GreenTech's Earth Week Movie Nite on April 23, 2024. The doors open at 5:30PM, film starts at 6PM with a discussion session after the film. This first run screening is free, donations gratefully accepted.



Earth Week Electronics Recycling Event

Celebrating Earth Day, ZWV's annual electronics recycling collection will take place on April 27, 2024 from 10am to 12pm at the High School. Enter via the east lot by the pool.

Accepted items: Computers, laptops, monitors, ink cartridges, CDs, DVDs, cassettes, printers, fax machines,

keyboards & mice, servers, routers, televisions, DVD & CD players, VCRs, audio components, radios, cellphones, telephones, cameras, electronic games and small electronics.

Place small items like loose ink cartridges, CDs, DVDs, cassettes, etc. in a bag for easy handling.

Not accepted:

No large rear screen projection TVs, no appliances except microwave ovens. No large commercial copiers, miscellaneous metal boxes, cabinets or devices. (Metals can be dropped off at the transfer station for free. Put them in the metals recycling dumpster.)

There is no charge except for CRT computer monitors and CRT TVs. All CRTs are \$10 per item. A CRT is an old-style monitor or TV with a picture tube inside.

Donations are gratefully accepted. They help support ZWV's continued work on island to divert waste from the landfill.

Vashon Library Resources

RIDWELL grows to over 500 subscribers on Vashon-Maury Island!

Ridwell had doubled its island subscribers for selected plastics, styrofoam, and other hard to recycle items in the last 9 months. You might have seen one of the 5 or so white vans in your neighborhood every other week. Friends can organize small co-ops and pool their materials with one pick-up subscriber to more affordably share the joy as you can see in this Ellisport example.



The Basic plan is \$14/month. Their Plastics Plus plan is \$18/month. This adds multilayer plastics. The unlimited plan costs \$24/month (two pick-ups) and that allows up to five 30 gal bags of each item [plastic film, multi-layer plastic, styrofoam (soft and hard), shoes/textiles, household batteries, household light bulbs, and a featured item].

Ridwell does a great job of explaining how and where the materials are recycled.

A Vashon RE-Use facility?

Do you hate seeing nice cabinets, sinks, or lights down in the pit at the transfer station? Construction waste going into the landfill is a continuing issue that some islanders would like to see addressed. A ZWV committee has formed to investigate the problem and explore solutions. One idea is to start a reuse facility where good quality cabinets, lighting and plumbing fixtures, windows, etc. could be returned to good homes at low cost.
