Zero Waste Vashon Timeline – 2024

10 years of Zero Waste Successes

- · First booth at the Strawberry Festival.
- · Basic tests of biochar in potted soil
- · Advocate for yard waste collection at the transfer station.

- · Start of yard waste pilot program at the transfer station, a first for the county.
- Meet with Waste Connections to advocate for residential recycling pickup (blue bin)
- Start the 3 yr. Waste to Garden (W2G) research project on the benefits of compost and biochar to unimproved native soil
- · Recycling compactor system started at transfer station to simplify recycling
